✓ that has more than one syllable (e.g. hello)

The final consonant is **doubled** before the vowel suffix is added.

✓ where the last syllable of the word is stressed (e.g. forgot or channe)

Remember that the consonant is not doubled if the second syllable

## Spelling Rules That Help Us

I can add suffixes beginning with vowel letters to words of more than one syllable.

Spelling Rule	Example Words
<ol> <li>The silent —e at the end of the root word is dropped when adding a suffix beginning with a vowel letter, except being.</li> </ol>	nicest
