
Week beginning: 18th May 2020


Monday – Story Sequencing


Can you put the story in order? If you play the story in the background, you can listen and sequence as you go. This will really help you. You could cut and stick the pictures in order or put numbers to the side.


Make it different: Can you write down the animals you see in sequence? i.e.


fireflies a friendly ladybird a bad tempered wasp Ladybird stag beetle

Extra Challenge: Can you retell the story in your own words using time connectives? You can words such as: first, next, then, after, in the end, finally etc.










<u>Tuesday – Speech</u>

Can you fill in the speech bubbles? What does the bad tempered ladybird say? What does the friendly ladybird say?




Make it different: Instead, you could act out the voices for the bad tempered ladybird and the friendly ladybird. How does your voice change?

Extra SPICY Challenge: Read the rules for speech (in a different file on website). Can you try to learn about speech marks and write your own speech sentences for the bad tempered ladybird?

"Want to fight?" said the bad tempered ladybird.

<u>Wednesday - Feelings</u>

One of the ladybirds is bad tempered and one of them is friendly. There are lots of words mean the same as these words. We call these **synonyms**. Can you sort the feelings? You could colour code the words or cut and stick.



Make it different: Create your own posters using two pieces of paper. Draw a happy face on one page and a grumpy face on the other page. Choose some adjectives to write on each page.

Extra Challenge: A list sentence contains three adjectives in a row and uses one comma and the word `and'.

Can you write a list sentence to describe the bad tempered ladybird using your favourite adjectives from the first activity? Can you write one about the friendly ladybird?

For example:

The bad tempered ladybird was vexed, displeased and annoyed.

The friendly ladybird was kind, gentle and nice.

Friday - Days of the Week

Make it different: Use ICT to type up your ideas. Work with your adult to change the colours and fonts. Instead you could draw a picture for something that happened each day with the day of the week written at the top.

Extra Challenge: If you want to challenge yourself you could try and make the sentences rhyme. Here is one Miss Richardson wrote:

On Monday he lost his spots! On Tuesday he got too hot! On Wednesday he bumped his toe! On Thursday a snail was slow! On Friday he needed a nap! On Saturday there was a mishap! On Sunday he was BAD TEMPERED!
