

Monday - Setting Description

Extra Challenge:




Extra Challenge:


Try testing your child by making up your own questions that your child could answer about the book. Swap roles and see if your child could come up with questions about the book for you to answer.




















Wednesday - Story Map
















Thursday - Be A Bug For The Day!


If you could be a bug for just one day, what would you do? Where would you go? Write it down inside your chosen bug. Remember you can be as imaginative and creative as you want. Think about how that bug moves, if it flies, where could it fly to?

Make it different:

You could make it into a game of 'What am I?'. You choose your chosen bug and your grown up can ask questions about you, e.g. Do you have wings? Where do you live? What colour are you? This is good way of getting your child to think of descriptive language to describe their bug.

Extra Challenge:

Can you come up with another bug, that isn't in the book and write what you would do if you were that bug? Draw your bug big and write inside it.



Friday - Crossword

Try this tricky crossword about 'The Cautious Caterpillar', using the book, can you find the right information to answer the questions. This a good way of practising your neat handwriting to fit into the boxes.

Make it different:

You could try the board game on the next page to test your knowledge on what happens in the book.

Make it different:

The Cautious Caterpillar Board Game

You will need:

- The Cautious Caterpillar Game Board
- Counters
- · Dice
- · Playing cards



Before you play:

- This game is for 2-6 players.
- Cut out the dice and glue the tabs together to make a cube.
- Cut out the counters (one for each player).
- · Cut out the playing cards.


How to play:

- 1. Place the counters at the start of the game on the egg.
- 2. Take it in turns to roll the dice and move around the board.
- If you land on a space with a flower on it, ask another player to pick up one of the playing cards and read it out to you. If you can answer the question correctly, you can move on one space. If not, you stay where you are.

Answer: an egg

Answer: sixteen

How do you know Cody liked being a butterfly by the end of the story?

Answer: Cody told the other caterpillar that being a butterfly is great.

Can you name two creatures in the story?

Answer: Choose any two of the following: caterpillar, ladybird, bee, grasshopper, butterfly.

Which two words were used to describe the leaf the caterpillar was eating at the end of the story?

Answer: tasty, green

What does Cody change herself into before she becomes a butterfly?

Answer: a chrysalis

"Lovely morning to be flying!" Who does Cody say this to?

Answer: the ladybird

How long does Cody stay in her chrysalis for?

Answer: for many days

What kind of minibeast is Cody at the beginning of the story?

Answer: a caterpillar

"Having six legs is great." Who says this?

Answer: the grasshopper
