Additional activities could include:

What do you think of the ending of the story? What other actions could the elephant have taken? Try to write an alternative ending.

Write your own version of the story, substituting the crocodile for a different animal. How might that animal behave? How could it camouflage itself against its surroundings?

Play Hide and Seek with your family. Can you camouflage yourself against your surroundings?

Research Crocodiles (Or another animal of your choice) and present your learning as a Fact File or information page (using ICT if possible). Include information about the animal's habitat and diet.

Can you find out about animals who use camouflage to hide themselves from their prey and/or protect themselves from predators?

How 'enormous' is a crocodile? Can you find out its average length? Which animals tend to be smaller? Larger? How tall are you? Measure yourself and other members of your family.

Use natural resources collected during your daily exercise, or from your own outdoor space. Can you create an image of a crocodile?

Use 'junk,' salt dough, play doh, clay or similar to create a 3D model of an Enormous Crocodile, or other characters from the story.

Read a variety of other stories by Roald Dahl. Which is your favourite? Why?
