## Questions...

#### Charlie and the Chocolate Factory

These questions are designed to help you think carefully about the beginning of the story. Try to use evidence from the text to help you answer clearly.

#### Chapters 1 and 2

- 1. Describe in your own words why the Buckets couldn't buy a better house.
- 2. Can you find evidence to show Charlie made his grandparents happy?
- 3. Why does Charlie wish he could go inside the chocolate factory?
- 4. Why do you think the grandparents enjoy telling Charlie stories?
- 5. Is this an effective opening? What is particularly good about it?
- 6. How does Roald Dahl use the opening to give us clues about the story?
- 7. The word 'true' is used 6 times in Chapter 2. Why do you think this is?
- 8. Roald Dahl describes lots of tempting inventions in Chapter 2. Which one appeals most to you and why? Which vocabulary do you like?
- 9. Why do you think Roald Dahl introduces Willy Wonka through stories?
- 10. Do you think Charlie will be a good hero? Explain carefully.
- 11. What features of good story writing have you spotted already?
- Describe in your own words the contrast between the two settings: Charlie Bucket's house and Willy Wonka's Chocolate Factory.

Remember to write in full sentences and lay out your work clearly.

On the Onchan School Website you will find lots of questions. It tells you at the top which chapters they are based on, so I would stop after those chapters, instead of trying to remember everything at the end!

I would write down some answers, using full sentences (remember to use part of the question in your answer) and discuss some of the answers too.

This is the moment when Charlie realises he has found a golden ticket!



**Writing Challenge:**Write a diary entry, written by Charlie, on the day that he finds his golden ticket. How would he feel? What sort of words would he use? Try to include some information about what the golden ticket says on the front and back. When you are writing a diary entry, remember to:

- describe the places where the events happened;
- write in the past tense;
- · talk about the important events;
- · use some personal pronouns, such as 'I', 'my' or 'me';
- talk about feelings;
- · use 'before', 'next', and 'after' to show the order of events.

Willy Wonka has invented 100s of chocolate bars, but now it is your turn! If you could create any chocolate bar what would it be?


I would have milk and white chocolate swirled together with chocolate brownie pieces!!
